Velcome to the NAN1 circuit ride. It is a beautiful 32km ride suitable for mountain bikes, hybrid bikes and gravel bikes. Allow 2 to 3 hours for a comfortable ride.

The NAN1 ride is a ride through Nanango's history, starting at the railway siding and leaves town on Mt Stanley Rd and going past the Nanango cattle dip. The area was named after Lord Stanley and was a forestry road in the 1950's. It turns into Mylett's Lane, named after the Mylett family who owned the property 'Niagra', still visible on the ride. A beautiful downhill section of the ride follows.



The route turns into Bullcamp Rd which was named because the Nanango Station bulls would camp on the flats in winter. A right turn leads to Grindstone School Rd and East Nanango Grindstone Rd. The area was settled by the Green family in 1901 and according to local legend, the Aboriginals sourced their stone from here to grind into axes. The route then takes a right turn into Mt Stanley Rd and past the cattle dip again and back to Nanango. There are 2 B&B accommodation sites, The Block Vista and Uncle Bob's Cabin on the route, as well as the wonderful hotels, motels and food outlets in Nanango town area.

Simply follow the NAN1 signs and enjoy the ride!
